The Southwestern PA Regional Threat Assessment Hub is a DHS-funded project run through the PA Commission on Crime and Delinquency and the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center (UPMC) to:

- Develop a multi-disciplinary, regional partnership in Allegheny, Armstrong, Beaver, Butler, Washington, and Westmoreland counties to link existing threat assessment and violence prevention activities;
- Formalize information sharing protocols among willing participants;
- Enlist Subject Matter Experts to train and consult on active threat cases; and
- Institutionalize a framework for ad-hoc or standing meetings among stakeholders to rapidly assess and mitigate threats.
